BMC is currently looking for autistic youth and their parents to participate in a research study on **supporting** the transition-to-adulthood.

You are eligible if you are a parent of a child with autism who is:

- □ Between age 14 and 21
- Currently enrolled in school
- ☐ Living at home with you

Participating families will receive a referral to work with a BMC transition specialist OR participate in a multi-family group education & support program called Transitioning Together, while your child partakes in a social group.
